

Warren Don Dusenberry, age 96, of Arapahoe, Nebraska, passed away on Monday, September 18, 2017 at Cambridge Memorial Hospital, Cambridge, Nebraska. He was born on November 6, 1920 southwest of Beaver City, Nebraska to Clifford & Luella (Cook) Dusenberry.

His family lived most of his childhood on a farm south of Oxford, Nebraska where he attended rural school and high school, graduating with the class of 1938. Don and his brothers spent their time helping their parent's farm and his grandparent's farm southwest of Beaver City on the Sappa Creek.

On October 26, 1941, Don was united in marriage to Bonita M. Hester at Beaver City. He became a member of the First Christian Church in 1941, where he served as a Sunday School Teacher, Deacon, and Elder for many years. In October of 1953, they adopted a 2-year-old boy Kenneth Dale. They continued farming their land until 1965 when they had a farm sale and moved to Boise, Idaho where Don entered the Boise Bible College. He graduated in May of 1967 with a Bachelor Degree in Sacred Literature. He ministered churches in Washington, Wyoming, and some in Oregon. Later they moved to Meridian, Idaho. Don worked for some time for the Meridian School Systems. They attended the Meridian Church of Christ, where he served as elder. After retiring they joined the Meridian Good Sam Traveling Club, during the summer months. They spent their time watching horse racing, skydiving, attending programs, and saw many ballgames.

In 1991, they moved to Arapahoe Nebraska, and attended the Arapahoe Church of Christ. Don was an Elder and Adult Sunday School Teacher. Later, they attend the First Christian Church in Beaver City.

In 1993, their son Kenneth died in a car accident in La Grande, Arizona, he was 42 years old.

Don is survived by his wife Bonita Dusenberry of Arapahoe, Nebraska
